The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) has been instituted by the Texas Legislature and is a program of diagnostic testing and developmental instruction designed to improve student success rates in Texas colleges. When entering college, students are required to meet established minimum standards on assessment tests in: math, reading and writing.

TSI Scores Needed

- Mathematics– 350
- Reading– 351
- Writing:
 - ⇒ Score of at least 340 with a minimum of 4 on the essay OR,
 - ⇒ Score of at least 340 with a minimum of 5 on the essay and ABE diagnostic level of at least 4

Students must reach college ready standards in BOTH Reading and Writing to enroll in a college-level English course.

Schools may go back up to 5 years to look at student's scores and scores may be applied retroactively.
